Robert Keith McBrayer was born and raised in Henry County and his family has been here for seven generations.

Keith was born on February 21, 1957 to Robert W. (Bobby) and Rebecca (Futral) McBrayer. Bobby served as a member of the Hampton City Council for more than 38 years with strong support from his wife and family. The Bobby McBrayer Park in Hampton was named in honor of his service to the community.

Keith married Susan Redmon on February 14, 1981. They have two children, Tracy and Laura. Laura is married to Keith Booth and they have four children; Reagan, Owen, Kinsley Kate and Brayden.

Sheriff McBrayer was active in the Boy Scouts as a child and earned the title of Eagle Scout at age 16. His hobbies include sports, boating, fishing and raising horses. He shares these hobbies with his family.

Keith developed an early interest in law enforcement and joined the Henry County Sheriff's Office as a radio dispatcher October 17, 1975 at the age of 18.
