Getting a Driver's License is Your Teens Top Priority

As of January 2007, all 16 year olds applying for a drivers license must complete 30 hours of Georgia Department of Driver Services approved classroom training, plus 40 hours of supervised driving, verified by a parent or guardian. Our program does **NOT** include the 40 hour driving portion of this requirement.



Making Sure Your Teen is Informed is Our Top Priority

Our program is taught by certified law enforcement officers in a learning environment. This is **NOT** a static presentation. Deputies involve the students and share photos and videos of accidents along with testimonies from teen drivers whose lives were changed in an instant. Deputies also explain traffic law and the consequences for being an unsafe driver.

At \$150, the cost for the 30 hour live and interactive Youth Driver Education Program is less than most other options. In addition to the potential for significant auto insurance discounts the State of Georgia offers up to a \$150 tax credit with a valid Certificate of Completion of the Henry County Sheriff's Office Youth Driver Education Program.
